## Argyle District

This is the name that was applied to an area slightly NE of Jolon. According to several writers, the district was named by Allen McLean, the "celebrated schoolmaster of the San Antonio School," after his Favorite Scottish author-statesman. That might have been George Douglas Campbell, the 8<sup>th</sup> Duke of Argyll, 1823-1900, postmaster-general, secretary of India and author of Scotland as It Was and as It Is (1887). There is an Argyle Road running from the Lockwood-Jolon Road to Jolon Road, and in earlier years Jolon Creek was known as Argyle Creek.

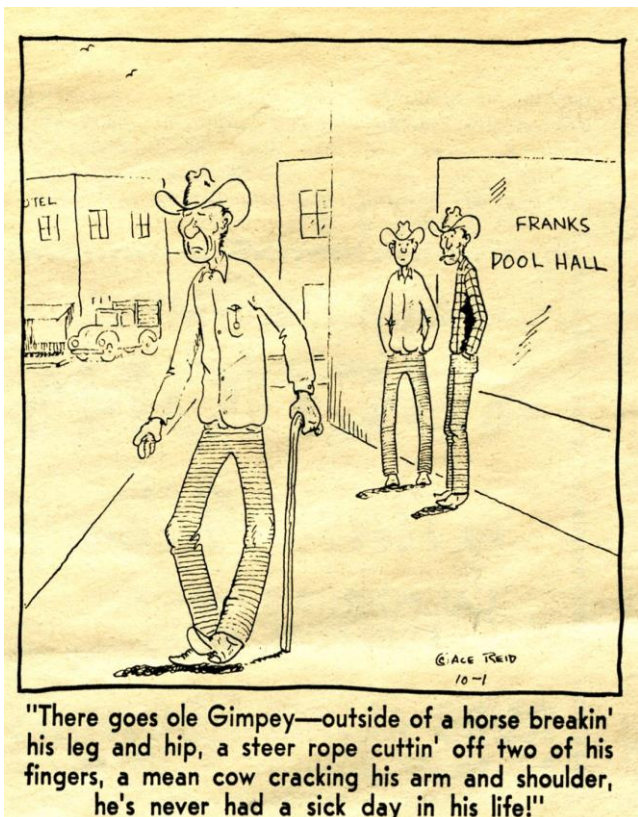
Writings of Velma Adams Dayton - 1960 - 1970's part 11

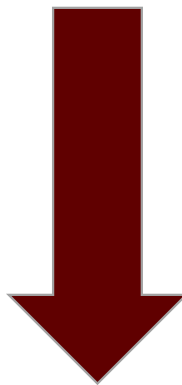
