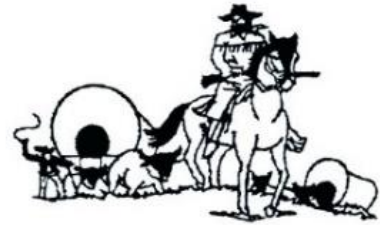

Bee Rock

This area straddles Monterey County and San Luis Obispo County. The Lower half of the canyon is now under water and forms an arm of the San Antonio Reservoir. There are at least two stories connected with the name. One has it according to the Bee Rock Store owner, in San Luis County, there was rock formation with a spring at the base and it attracted bees. Olive Wollesen thinks, however, that the rock had deep crack in it, which was inhabited by bees. This hunch was corroborated by Alice Clare Lynch who as a child lived a mile from what she called Bee Rock District, where people would search for honey which bees had stored among the rocks. And Ann Talley Adcock told interviewer that early settlers named it this because wild bees inhabited the jutting rocks along the road.

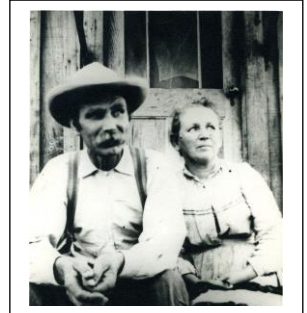

Lockwood, Jan. 13, 1909

Our Dear Son,

I suppose you think your folks have forgotten you because we have not written to you. But we have not and I know you don't think so either. Sunday Maud and Charlie was down and spent the day. I tell you it has been raining here pretty steady all week. Daddy says he has all hands busy making harness. Even little Bro. Charlie cut his finger to day but I guess it was not very bad. Today Blanch & Annie was up a while. The came up in the top butty. Our garden is coming up fine. I ask the folks what I must write to you about and Charlies says to talk about the weather and Ory says to tell you ever thing is alright and Daddy says to tell you it is a raining and Jim says to tell you to be a good boy. Jim rode Jennie last Sunday and she never done a thing. Every one around here is pretty well as far as I know. We have just had our supper and uncle is going over to Haus. So I have no time to write very much. I hear the river is up pretty high. Will P. has to cross on the cable to night. I have not found that iron yet that was lost. Did you get your apron O.K.? Love and Kiss to our dear Boy. So bye, bye.

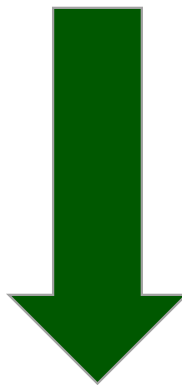
