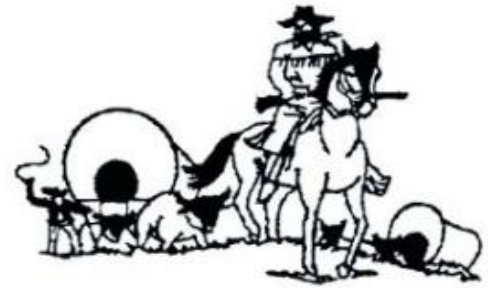

Veratina

This is the small settlement that grew up around the Veratina Mining Company's operation.

Veratina Post Office

This office was created by a name change. On November 7, 1888 "Veratina" replaced "Nasimento". This office served the residents around the Veratina Mining Company's bituminous sandstone operations, which was described as a minor development. The post office was east of Bryson and southwest of Bradley and very near the San Luis Obispo County line. It was discontinued July 31, 1895. Annie Kennedy was the first postmaster, she was also the postmaster for Nasimento before it changed names. It was stated that Veratina is Spanish for "edge of earthen jar" a descriptive term for location.

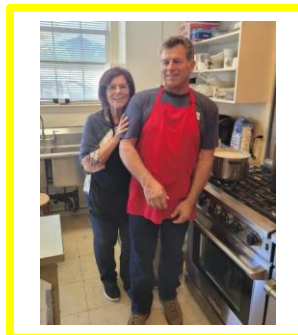

It is with sadness that we have lost a member, Tim Koester, Sr. Tim spent many hours working on equipment, using bull dozer to move equipment.

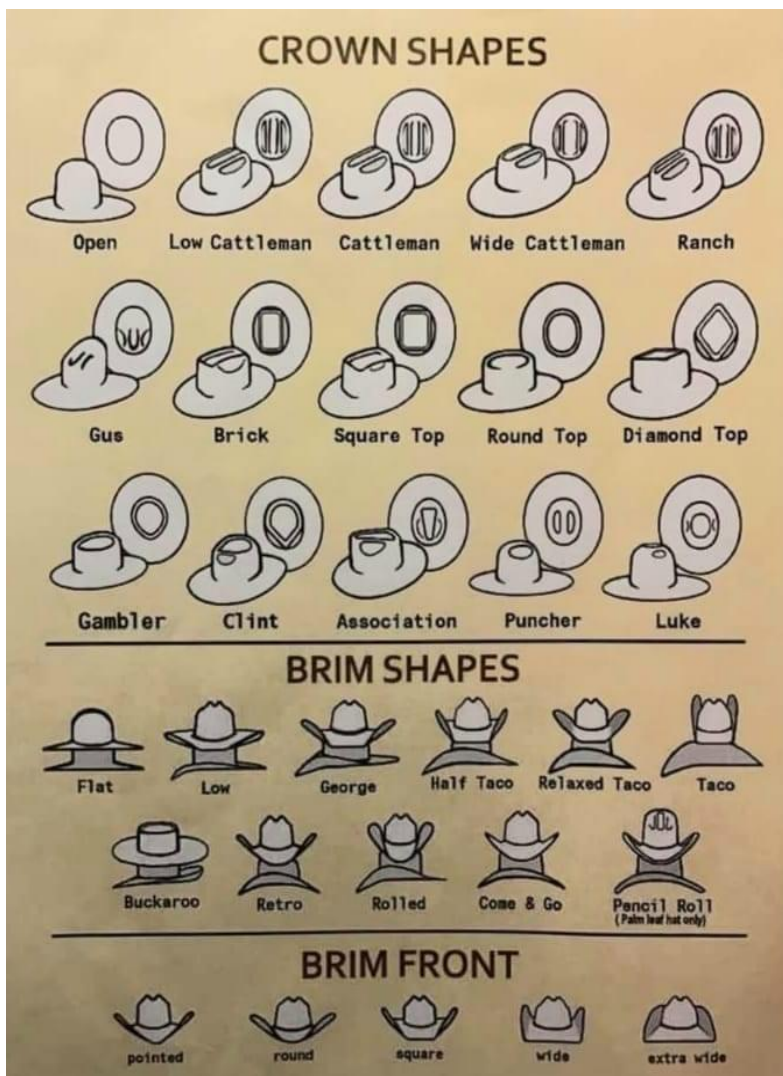
Tim will be greatly missed.
