Glau Canyon

Glau Canyon Heads in SEQ Sec. 29 T22SR22E and trends in SW to open onto San Antonio Valley about 1.5 m NE of Lockwood Named for the Glau Family. The Glau Brothers, Henry and Hans, came from Schleswig-Holstein, Germany, and settled in the Lockwood area in the late 1880's. They homesteaded a piece of ground on the west side of Lockwood grade.... They were later followed by their parents, Joachim and Fredericka Glau. John, a brother, came later....because his brother Henry told him of a big "wildcat" oil boom. Henry and John brought a farm from Perry Stretch about four miles southeast of Lockwood.....John Glau engaged in grain and cattle farming near Lockwood until his death in 1928.
